Note throughout the video the diversity of the landscape.

The cemetery in Jerusalem contains anywhere between 70,000 and 150,000 tombs from various periods, including the tombs of famous figures in Jewish history. The old Jewish cemetery sprawled over the slopes of the Mount of Olives overlooking the Kidron Valley (Valley of Jehoshaphat).

The Dome of the Rock [which is located on the Temple Mount] is an Islamic shrine located on the Temple Mount in the Old City of Jerusalem. (This is where the Muslims believe the prophet Mohammad ascended to Heaven).

Almond blossoms in Jerusalem ... The Menorah or Candle stick in the Holy Temple was shaped from this. Likewise think of Aaron's rod budding in the Old Testament. The Hebrew word *shâqêd* (for Almond Tree) spoke to the immutability and faithfulness of God.

The Kidron Valley is what separates the Temple Mount and the Mount of Olives.

Zechariah's Tomb - In Jewish tradition to be the tomb of Zechariah ben Jehoiada.

II Chronicles 24:20-22 "And the Spirit of God came upon Zechariah the son of Jehoiada the priest, which stood above the people, and said unto them, Thus saith God, Why transgress ye the commandments of the LORD, that ye cannot prosper? because ye have forsaken the LORD, he hath also forsaken you. And they conspired against him, and stoned him with stones at the commandment of the king in the court of the house of the LORD. Thus Joash the king remembered not the kindness which Jehoiada his father had done to him, but slew his son."

Jesus referenced this in Matthew 23.

Mount Tabor (lower Galilee) - In the Hebrew Bible (Joshua, Judges), Mount Tabor is the site of the Battle of Mount Tabor between the Israelite army under the leadership of Barak and the army of the Canaanite king of Hazor, Jabin, commanded by Sisera. In Christian tradition, Mount Tabor is the site of the transfiguration of Jesus.

Referred to as "Bashan" in the Bible, the Golan Heights was considered part of the Land of Israel. Its main city, "Golan in Bashan," (Deuteronomy 4:43, Joshua 21:27) was designated a "City of Refuge

Jezreel Valley also known as the Valley of Megiddo,^{[1][2]} is a large fertile plain and inland valley in the Northern District of Israel. It is bordered to the north by the highlands of the Lower Galilee region, to the south by the Samaritan highlands, to the west and northwest by the Mount Carmel range, and to the east by the Jordan Valley, with Mount Gilboa marking its southern extent.
